HOPEFUL FERTILITY PRESERVATION FOR KIDS WITH CANCER

Believe it or not, Frankie enjoys his chemotherapy days. He looks forward to fighting the cancer in his brain and along his spine. He likes to think that he is "blasting it off into space."

It is hard to imagine that kids like Frankie and his family have to think far beyond these moments, but the reality is that chemotherapy can often leave pediatric cancer patients infertile. That's why fertility preservation procedures before starting cancer treatments are becoming more common.

There aren't as many options for prepubescent boys, like Frankie, as there are for teenagers or adults. However, there is one experimental option involving testicular tissue cryopreservation before cancer treatment. [Read More](#)
